

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

(The following two sentences are in Spanish relaying information on the importance of this notice. Translated to English, it would read as follows: [This notice contains important information regarding your drinking water, please read the Spanish notice if it is included. If the Spanish notice is not included, please contact the water system and ask for a copy.])

MONITORING REQUIREMENTS NOT MET FOR: WILSONA GARDENS MUTUAL WATER COMPANY.

Our water system failed to monitor as required for drinking water standards during the past year and, therefore, was in violation of the regulations. Even though this failure was not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what you should do, what happened, and what we did to correct this situation.

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During the first quarter (January through March) of 2025, we failed to collect one raw groundwater source bacteriological sample and therefore, cannot be sure of the quality of our drinking water during that time.

What should I do?

- There is nothing you need to do at this time.
- The table below lists the contaminant(s) we did not properly test for during the last year, how many samples we are required to take and how often, how many samples we took, when samples should have been taken, and the date on which follow-up samples were (or will be) taken.

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- If you have health issues concerning the consumption of this water, you may wish to consult your doctor.

What happened? What is being done?

Wilsona Gardens Mutual Water Company did not collect a bacteriological sample from Well 2 in the first quarter of 2025 as required.

Wilsona Gardens Mutual Water Company will Comply with Health and Safety Code section 116555 and California Code of Regulations, title 22, section 64421, subdivision (b)(2), and for each year as scheduled take quarterly raw water samples from Well 2. We have since taken the required samples as described in the last column of the table above. The samples showed we are meeting drinking water standards.

Secondary Notification Requirements

Upon receipt of notification from a person operating a public water system, the following notification must be given within 10 days [Health and Safety Code Section 116450(g)]:

- SCHOOLS: Must notify school employees, students, and parents (if the students are minors).

- RESIDENTIAL RENTAL PROPERTY OWNERS OR MANAGERS (including nursing homes and care facilities): Must notify tenants.
- BUSINESS PROPERTY OWNERS, MANAGERS, OR OPERATORS: Must notify employees of businesses located on the property.
